About the concert

Summer! A time of flowers, starlit nights, and of course, Christmas. Join us through various depictions of summer, from the 13th-century round that opens the concert, through to the ethereal Rheinburger *Abendlied* depicting the close of day.

No summer-themed concert would be complete without a rendition of Gershwin's classic, while Jenny McLeod's iconic *Sun Festival Carols* provide a fresh perspective on summer and Christmas. Written for the 1983 Wellington Sun Festival, they inhabit a partly imaginary medieval world, illustrating a legend of seven stars with a musical palette heavily influenced by McLeod's study of 15th-century Christmas carols.

Gardner's effervescent *Tomorrow Shall Be My Dancing Day* is followed by another iconic setting of a famous text – the *Ave Maria*. "I am just a composer of little songs," claimed Franz Biebl, not knowing that this exquisite "little song" would become one of the most famous and beloved choral works of the 20th century.

Bob Chilcott's works reflecting on the passage of time seem appropriate as the year closes. Celebrating the luminous quality of a perfect summer day, the rightness of all things having a season, and embracing the beauty that life has to offer, his generally consonant harmonic language is punctuated by just enough insightful twists to intrigue the listener.

In its second verse, "All is healed, all is health. High summer holds the earth, hearts all whole," Lauridsen's *Sure on this Shining Night* gave the concert not only its title, but its theme. The thought of a night so beautiful that it is capable of holding all that has happened, and healing whatever might be broken, spoke deeply to me. As I chose the pieces for this concert, I

looked for works with a kind of beauty that communicated wholeness, and I hope that whether it's the Rheinberger or the Chilcott, the Gershwin, the Biebl, or another piece entirely, you catch a glimpse of something as exquisite as the whole earth held by a perfect summer's night.
